4.2 Criteria for acceptance of entries and closing date

Those wishing to take part in FORUM 8 Rally Japan 2022 must submit official electronic entry form published on the FIA Website https://registrations.fia.com/wrcjpn duly completed before the closing date for entries.

By sending an electronic form, the competitor undertakes to abide by the rules and regulations of the competition. Competitors will sign the entry form during Administrative Checks.

All entry forms must be received by the close of entries on Tuesday 11 October at 17:00 JST (UTC +9 hours).

Competitors entering to the national classes will use a separate entry form available on the rally website once entries open.







4.3 Number of competitors accepted

The maximum number of entries is 60. If more than 60 entries are received the organisers reserve the right to extend this number and to decide which entries among the Non-priority drivers will be accepted.

Cars will be divided into classes (and groups) as indicated in the 2022 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 12.4.

5 Service Park

5.1 Service Park information

The Service Park will be located at Toyota Stadium with the following GPS coordinates: N35 05 04.4 E137 10 15.4

Detailed final layout of the Service Park and extensive information will be available on the website in due time.

FIA priority competitors can access the Service Park from 12:00 on Friday 4 November. Non-priority competitors can access the Service Park from 7:00 on Saturday 5 November.

Flexi Service, in accordance with the 2022 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations Art. 59, will apply for the end of each day service.

5.2 Facilities at the Service Park

The following facilities and services will be provided at various points around the Service Park:

- Toilets
- Waste collection

For national competitors; please take your waste home with you.

Lightings (partially)

The following can be provided by the organiser for a fee upon prior request:

- Private toilets
- Hazardous waste collection
- Private security
- Telephone and private internet access
- Power supply (Electricity; 100V at 60Hz)
- Water supply
- Tents and any necessary office supplies

To order these facilities please use the "Service Park Facilities Order Form" from website.







Each competitor will be provided with the following area within the Service Park:

- WRC Registered as published by FIA (WRC Sporting Regulations Appendix VI)
- Non-priority service bays 5mx7.5m or as agreed.

5.3 Bringing your own fuel into the Service Park

The amount of fuel brought into the Service Park must be less than 40 liters (including for generators) per team under the Fire Service Act in Japan.

6 Two-way radio

The use of two-way radio is strictly regulated in Japan. Those wishing to use a two-way radio communication equipment must contact Rally Japan Administrative Office <<u>entry@rally-japan.jp</u>> by Tuesday 16 August. Specifications such as the frequency, model number and transmission output of the radio should be provided.

7 Fuel / Tyres

7.1 FIA fuel

Please note that P1 Racing Fuels is the new FIA fuel supplier for year 2022. The use of FIA fuel is obligatory for all priority drivers (FIA WRC, Art. 62.1.1). Non-priority drivers may choose to use FIA fuel or commercially available pump fuel at petrol stations, designated by the organiser.

Those competitors who have not used P1 Racing Fuel before, should make sure that their cars are compatible with this fuel (engine mapping etc.). P1 Racing Fuels also urges all competitors to carefully read the official letter concerning technical items, which can be found here: https://bit.ly/3H8tGVD . Also, consult your car manufacturer for correct oil specification to be used.

No later than 13 weeks prior to the event (Friday 12 August 2022), the competitors must notify their fuel requirements to the sole supplier P1 Racing Fuels at the following address https://bit.ly/3wChFTe, where you can find all necessary information.

7.2 Refueling

FIA Fuel will be available only at the designated Refuel Zones (RZ) indicated in the Road Book (Service Park and three Remote Refuel Zones shown on Art. 7.3 below).

Non-priority drivers may use commercially available pump fuel. This fuel must be dispensed directly into the competing car from pumps at service stations marked in the Road Book.

7.3 Remote Refuel Zones

Three Remote Refuel Zones (FIA fuel only) will be established as follows:

• Friday 11 November following SS3 & SS6 in Inabu N35 13 02.2 E137 30 34.5

• Saturday 12 November following SS9 & SS12 in Tsukude N34 58 34.1 E137 25 26.8 Sunday 13 November following SS17 in Nakatsugawa N35 29 47.4 E137 30 22.6







7.4 Safety fuel tanks

All cars must be fitted with an FIA approved safety fuel tank as defined in the FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art. 253.14. See also FIA Technical List No. 1. www.fia.com/regulation/category/761

Fuel tanks must be fitted with FIA-specified refuel couplings (FIA WRC, Art. 62.3.2). Non-priority drivers' cars which have the fuel tank in a separated place (trunk) with a firewall between this space and the cockpit, may have a normal cap for refueling directly from a pump pistol.

All non-priority competitors using pump fuel are reminded to pay attention to FIA WRC, Art. 62.3.7: cars equipped solely with FIA-specified refuel couplings and using commercially available pump fuel at service stations must transport the adaptor in the car and show it at pre-event scrutineering.

7.5 FIA fuel sample couplings

Cars of the FIA priority drivers must be fitted with FIA fuel sample couplings. See FIA WRC, Art. 62.3.5 and FIA Technical List No. 5.

7.6 Tyres (road surface: tarmac)

All competitors are reminded to comply with the 2022 WRC Sporting Regulations, Art.13 regarding tyres that may be used.

All competitors entered with a 4WD car must use tyres supplied by Pirelli (this applies also to those 4WD cars entered in National classes).

For 2WD cars the tyre manufacturer is free, but Articles 13.3.1 and 13.3.2 of the 2022 WRC Sporting Regulations must be complied with. For RGT cars, see Articles 13.4.1 and 13.4.2.

Tyre orders from Pirelli must be made by Monday 29 August at the latest, using the form available on the Rally Japan website.







8 Import of vehicles and spare parts/ driving in Japan

8.1 Driving of foreign-registered vehicles on domestic public roads

In order to run competition vehicles, recce-vehicles and service vehicles registered outside Japan, a temporary operation permit (temporary number plate) must be issued by Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport (MILT) through organizer.

To apply for a temporary operation permit, the vehicle registration card and vehicle inspection certificate are required. As the application process takes time, please send a copy of the required documents to the following address by 30th September prior to entry: rjentrant@rally-japan.jp

Please note you will be required a separate fee of getting the temporary operation permit number plate. Also, you must order via the official freight agency of Rally Japan (Please see below) regarding import/export and transportation in Japan, to ensure accurate and quick response. If you don't order through them, we cannot arrange the temporary number plate.

- (1) <u>ATA CARNET</u> can be used for the following vehicles/tools/parts/tyres (those are to be re-exported after the event), and promotional items. All of the items imported under ATA Carnet are to be re-exported after the rally. Even if it is temporary, the import of contraband goods is prohibited.
- (2) **PRO FORMA INVOICE** please check with the official freight agency of Rally Japan (CARS JAPAN Co.,Ltd.) on use of pro forma invoices.

Important notice Those wishing to import high pressure gas cylinders and other hazardous materials, foods, tableware and medical supplies must go through a cumbersome procedure coming with a cost and time-consuming paperwork to obtain special permission. On top of that, the procedure must be made by yourself. Therefore, we recommend procuring these items locally rather than importing them. The organisers plan to arrange for the sale of nitrogen gas and argon gas, as well as the rental of welding machine and other equipment.

8.2 Vehicle regulations

All vehicles taking part in Rally Japan must comply with and observe all the relevant domestic laws and regulations such as the Road Vehicles Act and the Road Traffic Law, as well as JAF National Sporting Regulations for Vehicles (lighting devices, noise level, etc) except when Appendix J of the FIA International Sporting Code defines otherwise. For vehicles that are not permanently registered in Japan, a documents (a) below are required and must be carried in the vehicles at all times. All rally cars, recce cars and







service cars that you drive on public roads are required to have (b) Rally Car Insurance.

- (a) 'Jibaiseki', compulsory insurance. All vehicles (including rally cars, all foreign registered vehicles, and domestically registered cars), that drive on public roads in Japan are required to be covered by it. Insurance premium for rally cars is included in their entry fee while it can be purchased at 7,000JPY for foreign vehicles not registered in Japan.
- (b) **Rally Car Insurance** (third party insurance). This is required for rally cars and recce cars. The insurance premium is 46,000JPY.

Those wishing to apply for the above (b) are required to complete an order form available at the rally website in due time.

8.3 Conditions on driving in Japan

(1) International visitors shall have a valid Japanese license or International Driving Permits (IDPs) issued by a signatory to the 1949 Geneva Convention in conformity with the Convention's provisions are recognized as valid for driving in Japan. An IDP on the other conventions or treaties, including the 1969 Vienna Convention, is invalid even if it is issued by a signatory to the 1949 Geneva Convention.

In addition, the following conditions must be satisfied: The IDP shall be valid for one year from the date of issue while you shall be allowed to drive with it for one year from the date of your entry into Japan.

(2) Those who possess a driving license issued in Switzerland, Germany, France, Belgium, Monaco or Taiwan meeting the following requirements will be allowed to drive in Japan. A Japanese translation prepared by an entity specified by law must be carried along with the original license.

Entities allowed by law to prepare the translation of the driving license are as follows:

- a) The issuing authority of the license, or the embassy or consulate of the issuing country in Japan
- b) Taiwan-Japan Relations Association for Taiwanese license
- c) Japan Automobile Federation (JAF) Details could be found on the JAF website: https://english.jaf.or.jp/driving-in-japan/drive-in-japan/switch-to-japanese-license







(3) If your driving license is not any of the above, you will be required to take a practical test and obtain a local license with 'Gaimen Kirikae' procedure.

Note1: Now that the Republic of Estonia has joined the Geneva Convention on Road Traffic, it is possible to drive in Japan with a convention approved International Driving Permit. This means that you may no longer drive in Japan with an Estonian driver's license accompanied by a Japanese Translation. If you plan to drive in Japan, please consider other means such as obtaining an International Driving Permit under the Geneva Convention.

Note2: In 'Gaimen Kirikae', the place of residence in Japan must be specified. For FORUM8 Rally Japan 2022, please make sure to specify "your place of stay (hotel, etc.) in Aichi Prefecture". For 'Gaimen Kirikae', the procedure must be completed at the designated Driver's License Examination Center. The Gaimen Kirikae procedure will be conducted on the date designated by the Rally Japan Secretariat, so you need to arrange your schedule well in advance of your arrival in Japan. Please be sure to contact the Rally Japan office in advance.

12.3 Types of accreditations

14.1 Airport - Chubu Centrair International Airport (NGO)

Aichi has Chubu International Airport which is one of the Asian hub airports, with flying to 30 international destinations and to 19 domestic destinations. It is located 40 min drive from the centre of Nagoya, and less than 30 min by Meitetsu rapid train.

14.2 Train

Nagoya is a city with good access by Shinkansen bullet train approximately 100 minutes from Tokyo and 50 min from Osaka. For access from Nagoya station to the Toyota Stadium (Toyota-shi station), see <u>Toyota Stadium website</u>. It takes approx. 70-80 minutes by train.

Shuttle bus service from the Chubu Centrair International Airport to Toyota-shi station is also available. It takes approx. 80minutes.

14.6 Average temperature / rainy days

High 19°C / Low 7°C; on average five rainy days in November (Toyota City).

14.7 Currency

The currency is Japanese Yen (JPY/Y). Banknotes and coins are identified easily. There are Y1,000, Y2,000, Y5,000 and Y10,000 banknotes; and Y1, Y5, Y10, Y50, Y100 and Y500 coins.

Exchange rate as of 8 July: €1 = approx. ¥138.

Japan is more of a cash-based society though major credit cards are now widely accepted especially in most large-scale retailers and hotels. You can buy Yen at Authorized Foreign Exchange banks, major post offices, international airports and other authorized money exchanger hotels and department stores.

14.8 Tax

The Consumption Tax in Japan currently is 10%. Although all price tags must display total amount with tax included, some are not actually the case.







14.9 Tipping

Tipping is not a common practice in Japan.

14.10 Electricity

The voltage commonly used in Japan is 100 volts, and frequency in Aichi is 60Hz. Plug type is as same as those used in USA and Canada

14.11 Mobile phone

While most of the modern mobile phones can be used in Japan, many older phones may not work due to different technologies. Most importantly, GSM-only phones do not work as there is no GSM network in Japan.
